At Courage Center, we specialize in treating brain injury, spinal cord injury, stroke, chronic pain, autism and developmental delays, bone and joint disorders, progressive neurological disorders (MS, Parkinsons), and disabilities experienced since birth. Founded in 1928, Courage Center is a nonprofit organization offering advanced technologies and innovation provided in part through the efforts of thousands of volunteers and donors.

Therapy services are available at four Courage Center locations in the Twin Cities and at several other partner locations.

Our Golden Valley, Stillwater and Forest Lake locations provide services for all ages – adults, teens, children and infants. Our Burnsville location has a pediatric focus. Physician services are available in Golden Valley.

Our independent living, rehabilitation therapy, vocational services, recreational and sports activities, and summer residential and day camps bring Courage Center into the daily lives of people where they work, learn and play.

Welcoming all ages and all abilities

Our physicians, therapists and staff members are experienced in working with people of all ages and all physical abilities. At Courage Center, programs are customized to meet the needs of people with a variety of diagnoses:

- autism
- brain injury (traumatic and non-traumatic)
- chronic and auto-immune diseases (arthritis, fibromyalgia)
- chronic pain and work-related injuries
- congenital disabilities (muscular dystrophy, spina bifida, cerebral palsy)
- developmental delays in children
- neurological injury and/or diseases (multiple sclerosis, Parkinsons, Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis [ALS])
- orthopedic conditions and injuries
- sensory disorders and speech/language delays in children
- spinal cord injury
- stroke
- weakness, deconditioning and/or obesity

Courage Center at Home

Courage Center at Home is an innovative approach to people with neuro-rehabilitation needs due to a brain injury, stroke or other neurological condition. A comprehensive, inter-disciplinary medical rehabilitation team works with clients, families and caregivers in their home and community. Our treatment team consists of physical therapists, speech/language pathologists, occupational therapists, rehabilitation nurses, clinical coordinators, clinical psychologists, clinical social workers or behavior analysts. Treatment is provided in settings where people need to function independently: in their home, grocery store, bank, school, pharmacy and other locations. Treatment provided in these settings is more effective and efficient for people who have difficulty associating how to perform a task or activity from one setting to another.

Our team of experienced Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation physicians are specialists who treat people with spinal cord injuries, acquired brain injuries, stroke, congenital disabilities and other health concerns that are barriers to health and independence. Services include: evaluations and management of rehabilitation issues; neuro and musculoskeletal rehabilitation and comprehensive spasticity evaluation and management including therapy, oral medication, splinting, Botox and phenol injections and intrathecal Baclofen pump management and refills.



Transitional Rehabilitation Program

The Transitional Rehabilitation Program (TRP) is a short-term, intensive, inpatient rehabilitation unit that serves people with spinal cord injury, traumatic brain injury, stroke and congenital disabilities. While staying in the TRP, clients work toward living independently in the community. They participate in therapy as well as work on school and career goals, adjustment to life with a disability, or learn about the many available adapted sports and recreational opportunities.

Chronic Pain Rehabilitation Program

Our Chronic Pain Rehabilitation Program is a comprehensive, inpatient, three-week multidisciplinary program for people who, in spite of undergoing standard medical treatment, continue to experience chronic pain. Clients admitted into this program often have exhausted standard medical treatment options. Outcome studies show that our program model provides the best opportunity to improve health and well-being and return to a functional lifestyle. Outpatient pain management services are also available.

Neuro Navigator

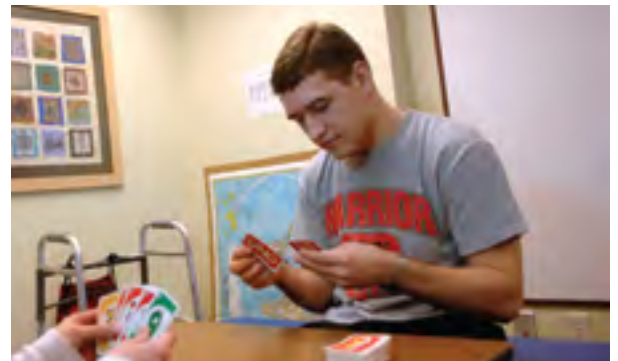

Our Neuro Navigator acts as case manager to outpatients who have a brain injury and use two or more outpatient therapy services at our Golden Valley facility. Services include client contact, evaluation scheduling and ongoing coordination of care with the client, physician and team. This unique service gives Courage Center clients, with complex needs, a go-to person to assist them and the team, ensuring quality outcomes and client satisfaction.

Psychological Services

Whether a person is born with a disability or acquires one later in life, disability presents unique challenges to the individual, the family and the support system. Courage Center's psychological professionals are experienced in working with people with disabilities in individual, family and group settings to promote health and optimal independence. Therapy can be coordinated with other rehabilitation therapies or used as a single service.





Neuropsychological Services

Neuropsychological evaluation and consultation are available for all ages with acquired and traumatic brain injury. Our neuropsychologists can address level of functioning, return to school or work, and community resources and supports.

Community Reintegration Program (CRP)

CRP is an outpatient program that helps adults with mild to moderate brain injury reintegrate life tasks and roles into their community. CRP's coordinated approach works with individuals to develop skills and strategies to address deficits in: attention, memory, problem solving, awareness, adjustment to disability, and other impairments caused by acquired brain injury. A medical referral is required for this service. Call for more information on programming fees and payment options.

Driver Assessment and Training

Courage Center provides services to older drivers and people with neurological, degenerative, mental or congenital disabilities. Lessons and assessments are provided for both the new and experienced driver to determine ability for safe residential, city or freeway driving. Services are offered in a sedan and/or state-of-the-art adapted van. Ask about our discount for AAA members.

Living more independently

Many of our services, such as vocational rehabilitation and independent living skills, are designed to help people live more independently in the community. For some, that means preparing to transition to adulthood: managing their own affairs and preparing for college or work. For others, it means assistance re-entering the workforce after an injury or illness, or learning how to manage household tasks with new physical challenges.

Courage Center offers many services that go beyond traditional rehabilitation therapies. Our non-traditional services help boost self-confidence and independence, improve health and well-being, and provide opportunities to get a job, get involved and have fun.

Adult Rehabilitative Mental Health Services (ARMHS)

ARMHS is a program for people on Medical Assistance who also have a mental health diagnosis or brain injury and could benefit from services to regain skills related to independent living, involvement in the community or managing their mental health. Assistive technology (AT) can be as simple as a wheelchair cup holder or as complex as a head-controlled computer system. At Courage Center, we offer an array of services to help people with disabilities find assistive technology solutions. Assistive technology is part of everything we do, every service we offer, from outpatient therapy to driver assessment and training, from aquatics to sports and recreation, for people of all ages and all abilities.



Independent Living Skills (ILS)

ILS staff work with people to strengthen their daily living skills so they can learn to do more for themselves. They provide assistance in all areas related to community living, including managing a household and finances; finding or maintaining affordable, accessible housing; developing a healthy lifestyle; identifying recreational and vocational opportunities; and accessing the community. Our knowledgeable and dedicated staff help identify assistive technologies needed to help a person succeed in work or school. Fitness is important for everyone, and especially for people with disabilities who are prone to secondary health conditions such as weight gain, high blood pressure and diabetes. Courage Center Fitness Centers have stationary bikes, treadmills and other fitness equipment that is accessible for use by people of all abilities, including those who use wheelchairs.

Warm-Water Pool

The aquatic program at Courage Center offers low-impact, physical activity in warm water that helps increase flexibility and strength, stamina and balance. Authorization from your doctor is required for pool therapy. Recreational pool programs are also available without a physician referral. First-time pool users must complete an initial assessment and orientation. During the assessment, a recreation therapist specializing in aquatic therapy designs a program that meets a person's individual needs and goals. Our experienced, certified recreational therapists offer:

- one-on-one pool therapy
- independent therapeutic exercise
- group classes
- swim lessons
- relaxation techniques
- Watsu, a highly-regarded, gentle form of body therapy performed in warm water

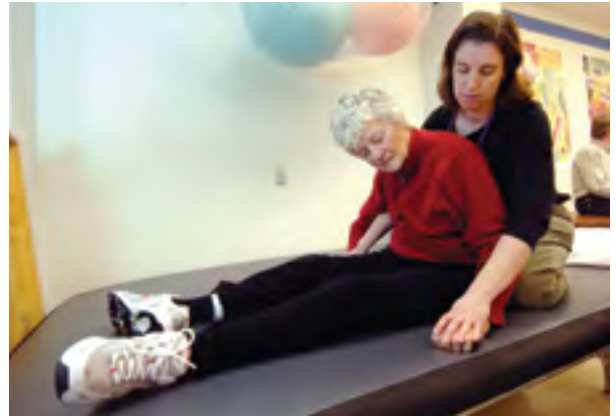

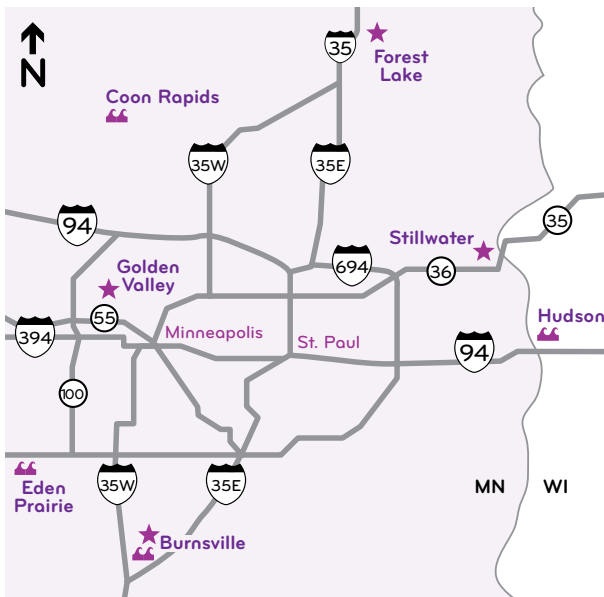

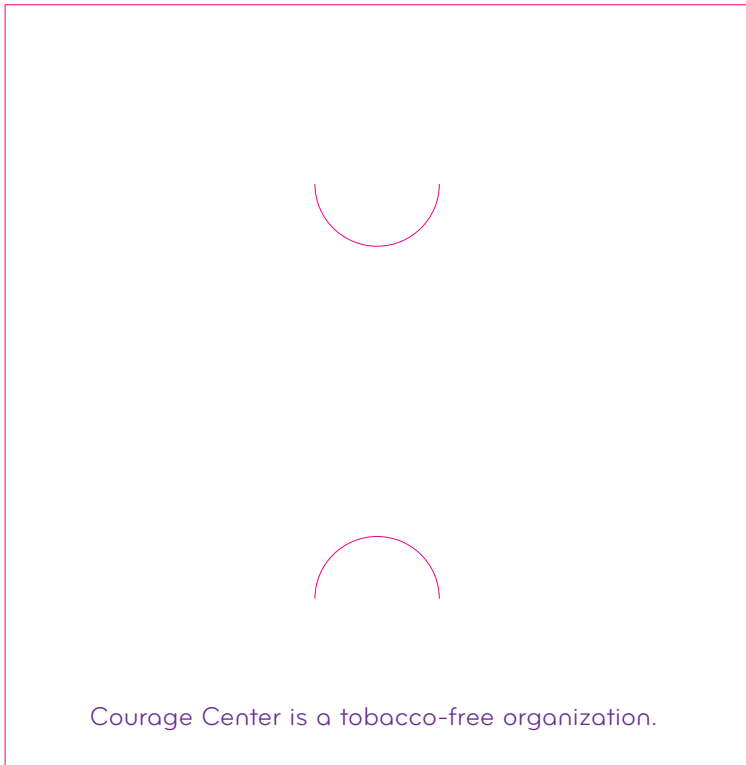
